







Introduction

The University of Dundee and Dundee University Students' Association (DUSA) work in partnership to support and enhance our student experience.

The Student Partnership Agreement or SPA is a co-operative framework for delivering measurable and tangible improvements to our student experience. It is a joint statement that outlines our mutually agreed priorities and the actions we wish to achieve together. The priorities will remain constant for the next 3 academic years, and the actions will be updated annually to reflect progress.

It is recognised that both organisations have many goals that they wish to achieve, this statement does not seek to articulate them all, it focuses on a core set of achievable and measurable actions that we believe we can deliver together and that our community will benefit from, and, can be part of achieving.



Where are we now?

Both organisations have experienced significant change since the last SPA was developed. New strategic plans have been developed and launched by both DUSA and the University under new leadership teams. The pandemic has brought significant organisational challenges, and has impacted our community in many ways both personally and professionally. Recent feedback from our students indicates many are less satisfied with their experience, don't feel connected to a community and are unsure about how they can use their voice to create change.

This SPA has also been developed at a time of important political, societal, environmental and cultural shifts, with much needed global recognition being brought to social justice, the environment, and democratic engagement.

In developing this new SPA both organisations recognise that this is an opportunity to work together to enable our community to;

- Reflect on our collective experience over the past three years.
- Consider what we want our future to be.
- Work together to achieve meaningful goals, that will bring real change to our student experience here at Dundee.




Our Priorities

Engaging our Community



Launch of the prematriculation module (phase 1) in Autumn 2022 to all students.

Advisee meetings have taken place as outlined in the Adviser of Studies Handbook and Research Degrees Quality Code.

Student satisfaction scores improve across the following surveys – semester Pulsecheck survey, National Student Survey (NSS), Postgraduate Taught Experience Survey (PTES), and Postgraduate Research Experience Survey (PRES) A record of all student awards and prizes across all Schools and Directorates has been established, to support greater communication of student success across programmes/Schools.

Opportunities for taught students to develop their experience of research offered across all Schools in both credit-bearing modules and through informal development opportunities.

Student satisfaction scores improve across the following surveys – semester Pulsecheck survey, NSS, PTES, PRES Survey (PRES) Information provided to all students and staff to raise awareness of the role of School President.

All Schools have elected School Presidents in place following the elections in Spring 2023.

At least 75% of School President positions are contested in Spring 2023.

Publishing of a School President 'survival guide' produced by out-going School Presidents.
