Applications are invited for a Studentship/Graduate Teaching Assistantship in History. Preference will be given to candidates interested in participating in the European Doctorate in Women's and Gender History in which Dundee is a partner institution.

Project details

The successful candidate will be expected to undertake teaching-related duties, not normally more than five contact hours per week, while pursuing research leading to a PhD. Our intention is that, in addition to obtaining a PhD, the successful candidate will also gain valuable experience in teaching and will be strongly encouraged to participate in the University of Dundee's staff development programme. Applicants will be awarded a full fee waiver and will receive a bursary of £5,000 per annum towards living expenses.

Entry requirements

Applicants will have a good first degree and a Masters degree in History or a related discipline. Particular preference will be given to applicants whose area of research interest lies in the modern or early modern history of continental Europe. Given staff specialisms, preference will be given to candidates who wish to study in one of the following areas: Italian, Russian, French or German history (19th and 20th centuries) or early modern Spanish or Italian history. Particular research interests of staff include the history of policing, crime and prostitution; social unrest and resistance; gender and Fascism; gender and work; the history of sexuality; gender and war; gender and imperialism; feminism(s); Russian culture; European noblewomen (c.1600-1800). Language requirements

All applicants must have a very high standard of written and spoken English. Those wishing to participate in the European doctorate must also have a good working knowledge of at least one other European language relevant to the consortium (i.e. French, Italian, German or Spanish).

Other requirements

Students on the doctorate are required to spend one semester at another partner or affiliated institution and they will have the opportunity to meet with other doctoral candidates on the programme in an annual week of joint teaching held in one of the consortium universities. Transnational supervision is a possibility where appropriate.
