Postgraduate Certificate in Water Law

The Postgraduate Certificate (PG Cert) in Water Law is offered as part of the Water Law Water Leaders (WLWL) summer graduate programme of executive teaching delivered by the IHP-HELP Centre for Water Law, Policy & Science under the auspices of UNESCO. WLWL is focused on developing a new generation of local water leaders to effect locally-devised and locally-driven solutions to water issues locally and globally. The PG Cert can be completed in 7 to 10 weeks on campus, depending upon modules taken, during the months June - July - August 2011.

Orientation week commences on the 13th June 2011. WLWL modules cover the three core areas of water law - international water law, comparative national water law, and the regulation of water services. Each of these modules lasts three weeks; there is also an online WLWL induction module, which students should complete ahead of orientation week. For the PG Cert award, students need to have successfully completed any three of these four modules.

Course content

- Induction module by Distance Learning; students taking this module for credit should register with sufficient time to complete the module before beginning the summer programme in Dundee, but alternative arrangements are also possible, please contact the course leader to discuss timings.
- Module 1, Comparative National Water Law: focus on regulatory frameworks, decision making/governance, and relevant rights, powers and obligations, commences 20 June 2011.
- Module 2, Regulation of Water Services: focus on ownership and regulation of service providers whether in the public or private sectors, commences 11 July 2011.
- Module 3, International Water Law: focus on the rights and obligations that exist, primarily between States, for the management of transboundary water resources. These rules are dedicated to preventing conflict and promoting cooperation, commences 1 August 2011.

To apply

- Normally a good Honours degree in a relevant discipline
- IELTS 6.5 or equivalent for applicants whose first language is not English
