Vice-Chancellor's Regional Scholarships 2023/4: Key Facts Document/Terms & Conditions

This Key Facts Document sets out the main details of the Scholarships, as at date of publication, and covers the following awards: Africa, South Asia, Indonesia.

Date of publication	September 2022, applicable to 2023/4 academic year (September 2023 or January 2024 entry)
Application Process	There is no separate application form for the Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship(s), for any region: Africa, South Asia, or Indonesia.
	 The University of Dundee Admissions Team will use information from an individual's Course application to determine if they meet the eligibility criteria. This verification process will happen at the initial Offer stage. Where the applicant provides evidence their current domicile is within one of the above
	regions or countries.
Who is eligible?	 All applicants must: Hold an offer to study an eligible Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught course at the University of Dundee: Undergraduate - Must hold an offer for a full time, on campus course - this excludes any course in the School of Medicine or Dentistry. Note: The course must be 120 credits Postgraduate taught - Must hold an offer for a full time, on campus course in any academic school. Note the course must be 180 credits, apart from PGDip in Professional
	 Legal Practice which is covered by the Scholarship. Master of Research (MRes) and Masters by Research Courses are covered by this scholarship.
	 Be classified as an International Fee-paying student by the University of Dundee. Not be studying a PhD Course. Have a Course tuition fee of £19,600.
	NB: Any course which does not have a fee of this value, or above, will not be considered for this award.
Scholarship Information	 The value of this scholarship is: a. £5,000 for the Vice-Chancellor's Africa award; b. £4,000 for Vice-Chancellor's South Asia and Indonesia awards.
	2. Applicants in receipt of the South Asia or Indonesia Scholarship are not eligible to submit an application for the Global Citizenship Scholarship, but will be eligible for the Global Excellence Scholarship should the criteria be met.
	 All scholarships are paid as a tuition fee waiver. No direct payment is made to any applicant. The scholarship is paid in each year of applicable study:
	a. Undergraduate applicants can receive the scholarship for up to 5 years of progressing study. (Up to £25,000 for Africa, and £20,000 for South Asia and Indonesia).
	b. Where the course is a 3.5-year Undergraduate Degree (School of Business), then the scholarship will only be applied in Year 2 onwards.
	c. Postgraduate Taught applicants (including Master of Research and Masters by Research) - where the course spans more than 12 months full time, and a full year tuition fee is due in each academic year, the scholarship will be applied in both years of study.
	d. Where the tuition fee is reduced in Year 2, then the scholarship will only be applied in Year 1.
	5. Scholarships are awarded on an Unconditional basis. However, this is not linked to the Course application status.

	6. Scholarships cannot be awarded on a pro-rata basis.
Key Information	 This scholarship is applicable in the entry year to the University of Dundee only and cannot be backdated to previous years. The University will not offer a scholarship to
	students who have matriculated at the University in their chosen programme of study.Applicants are unable to combine the Vice-Chancellor's scholarship(s) with:
	 Applicants are unable to combine the Vice-Chancellor's scholarship(s) with: a. Any other University of Dundee scholarship, except for the University of Dundee
	Alumni Scholarship. If an applicant is eligible for both scholarships, they can be combined to a maximum of £8,000.
	b. Any externally, partially funded scholarship. If the external scholarship is lower
	than the Vice-Chancellor's scholarship(s), then the applicant must select an applicable scholarship.
	c. If the applicant holds a fully funded external scholarship, the Vice-Chancellor's
	Scholarship(s) will be removed as all tuition fees will be covered. The University will not provide the Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship as an additional award.
	3. Should an applicant wish to defer their entry to the University of Dundee, the following
	rule applies:
	a. Deferral within the same academic year: Scholarship can also be deferred.
	b. Deferral to a new academic year: Scholarship cannot be deferred.
	4. Clearing applicants are eligible to receive this scholarship, and eligibility will be assessed
	as above.
	5. International College Dundee applicants are eligible to receive this scholarship in the entr
	year to the main Degree at the University of Dundee.
	6. If an applicant changes Course before, during or after matriculation, the University
	reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the Scholarship
	Offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed. 7. If an applicant changes Fee status or any other personal information before, during or
	 If an applicant changes Fee status or any other personal information before, during or after matriculation, the University reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for
	scholarships and may retract the Scholarship Offer should an applicant's eligibility have
	changed.
	8. If an applicant has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded the Vice-
	Chancellor's Scholarship, the value of the scholarship will be refunded to the applicant
	after they have enrolled at the University of Dundee. Alternatively, this can be transferred
	to the University accommodation account balance (if applicable).
	9. The scholarship is only paid to applicants in the years in which full tuition fees are paid.
	This applies to applicant who may study abroad during their Undergraduate studies. The
	University of Dundee fees department will confirm the status of the scholarship where
	required.
	10. All communication with the student will be via email, and to the @dundee.ac.uk email
	address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant. Types of communication may be:
	a. Confirming the scholarship;
	b. Informing the applicant that they have not met the criteria to be awarded the
	scholarship.
	c. Requesting further information.
	11. We are unable to disclose details of the scholarship to anyone other than the applicant
	unless consent is given to do so.
	12. Should a student withdraw from programme of study, the University Fees department
	may be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance.
	13. All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
