## JEP MSc Progression Scholarships 2023/4: Key Facts Document/Terms & Conditions

This Key Facts Document sets out the main details of the Scholarship, as at date of publication.

Date of publication	December 2022.
	Applicable to the 2023/4 academic year (being September 2023, or January 2024 entry for courses that offer January entry)
Application Process	There is no separate application form for the JEP MSc Progression Scholarship.
	The University of Dundee will use all information detailed on an applicant's course application to determine if they meet the eligibility criteria for the relevant course of study.
	This verification process will happen at the initial offer stage.
	• Where an applicant does not meet the criteria for the JEP MSc Progression Scholarship, the University of Dundee may inform the applicant of other scholarships available on different courses in the University of Dundee.
Who is eligible?	In order to be eligible for a JEP MSc Progression Scholarship, all applicants must meet the eligibility criteria noted below:
	<ol> <li>Hold an offer to study at the University of Dundee on one of the following programmes of study:         <ul> <li>MSc Biomedical Engineering</li> <li>MSc Medical Imaging</li> <li>MSc Health Data Science for Applied Precision Medicine</li> <li>MRes Sports Biomechanics and Rehabilitation.</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
	(together the "Eligible Programmes")
	(Note the course must be studied full time, on campus.)
	2. Be classified as an International Fee-paying student by the University of Dundee.
	3. Not currently studying a PhD Course.
	There are two different tiers of Scholarship available to each applicant, the eligibility for each tier will depend on the level of achievement at the time of application:
	<ul> <li>To be eligible for a Tier 1 Scholarship: The applicant must have an average of at least 78% (15/C1) in their Y1-Y3 core modules of the BEng (Hons) Biomedical Engineering (Joint Education Programme with Northeastern University China)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>To be eligible for a Tier 2 Scholarship: The applicant must have a lower than an average of 78% (15/C1) in their Y1-Y3 core modules of the BEng (Hons) Biomedical Engineering (Joint Education Programme with Northeastern University China)</li> <li>UK Equivalencies of all Academic Qualifications are at the discretion of the</li> </ul>

Scholarship Information	The JEP MSc Progression Scholarship is awarded as a discount on tuition fees. This is only available to students who meet the eligibility criteria outlined above and commence study on one of the Eligible Programmes. No direct payment will be made to any applicant.
	1. Tier 1 Scholarship:
	The value of this scholarship is £9,000
	Tier 2 Scholarship:
	The value of this scholarship is £5,000
	2. The scholarship is paid in the year of applicable study.
	3. Scholarships are awarded on an unconditional basis. However, this is not linked to the course application status.
	4. Scholarships cannot be awarded on a pro-rata basis.
Key Information	1. This scholarship is applicable to the entry year to the University of Dundee only and cannot be backdated to previous years.
	2. Applicants are unable to combine the JEP MSc Progression Scholarship with:
	a. Any other University of Dundee scholarship.
	<ul> <li>Any externally, partially funded scholarship. If the external scholarship is lower than the JEP MSc Progression Scholarship, then the applicant must select an applicable scholarship.</li> </ul>
	c. If the applicant holds a fully funded external scholarship, the JEP MSc
	Progression Scholarship will be removed as all tuition fees are covered. The University of Dundee will not provide the JEP MSc Progression Scholarship as an additional award.
	3. Should an applicant wish to defer their entry to the University of Dundee, the
	following rule applies: a. Deferral within the same academic year: Scholarship can also be deferred.
	b. Deferral to a new academic year: Scholarship cannot be deferred.
	4. If an applicant changes course before, during or after matriculation, the University
	of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may
	retract the scholarship offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed. 5. If an applicant changes Fee status or any other personal information before, during
	or after matriculation, the University of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the scholarship offer should an
	applicant's eligibility have changed. 6. If an applicant has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded the JEP MSc
	Progression Scholarship, the value of the scholarship will be refunded to the
	applicant after they have enrolled at the University of Dundee. Alternatively, this can
	be transferred to the University of Dundee's accommodation account balance (if applicable).
	7. The scholarship is only paid to applicants in the years in which full tuition fees are paid. This applies to applicant who may study abroad during their Undergraduate
	studies. The University of Dundee fees department will confirm the status of the
	scholarship where required.
	8. All communication with the student will be via email, and to the @dundee.ac.uk email
	address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant. Types of communication may be:
	a. Confirming the scholarship;
	b. Informing the applicant that they have not met the criteria to be awarded the

9.	scholarship. c. Requesting further information. We are unable to disclose details of the scholarship to anyone other than the applicant unless consent is given to do so.
11.	Should a student withdraw from the programme of study, the University of Dundee's finance department may be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance. All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
12.	All scholarships are subject to University of Dundee Scholarship Terms and Conditions.
