| Application<br>Process     | There is no separate application form for the ICD Progressing with Excellence Scholar The academic team at the International College Dundee assess the academic performance of the student during their time studying in the College and determine it they have met the criteria to be eligible to receive this scholarship.  |  |  |  |  |
| Who is eligible?           | <ol> <li>All applicants must:</li> <li>Be classified by the University of Dundee and Oxford International Education Group (OIEG) as an International Fee-paying student.</li> <li>Have completed an ICD full time programme (online or on campus), AND progress to a full time (180 credits, 12 months for PG; 120 credits per year, 3-4 years for UG), on campus UoD programme.</li> <li>Have achieved one of the following during the study of their full programme at ICD:         <ul> <li>overall, achieve an 'A' grade average in their academic performance</li> <li>show a significant uplift in academic performance during their time at ICD and achieve excellent ('A' grade average) academic performance in the final term</li> </ul> </li> </ol>  |  |  |  |  |
| Scholarship<br>Information | <ol> <li>The value of this Scholarship is £6000 and is awarded as a tuition fee waiver to the UoD fees once the student has progressed from ICD to their chosen UoD programme.</li> <li>The scholarship for students on a pathway programme leading to a UoD undergraduate programme is awarded for each year of study, up to a maximum of 4 years up to £24,000.</li> <li>The scholarship for applicants applying for an ICD pathway programme leading to a UoD postgraduate taught master's is awarded for each year of study, up to a maximum of 2 years up to £12,000.</li> <li>All scholarship awards are offered on an unconditional basis.</li> <li>All scholarship awards are deducted from UoD tuition fees and are not paid directly to any student.</li> </ol>   |  |  |  |  |
| Key Information            | <ol> <li>Applicants are unable to combine the Progressing with Excellence scholarship with:         <ul> <li>a. Any other University of Dundee scholarship, except for the University of Dundee Alumni Scholarship and Discover Life Sciences Scholarship. If an applicant is eligible for both scholarships, they can be combined to a maximum of £9,000 per academic year.</li> <li>b. Any externally, partially funded scholarship. If the external scholarship is lower than the Progressing with Excellence scholarship, then the applicant must select an applicable scholarship.</li> <li>c. If the applicant holds a fully funded external scholarship, the Progressing with Excellence Scholarship will be removed as all tuition fees are covered. The University will not provide the Progressing with Excellence Scholarship as an additional award.</li> </ul> </li> <li>If a student has funding as part of a partnership agreement, then they cannot hold a Progressing with Excellence scholarship in addition to this. The higher value award will apply.</li> </ol> |  |  |  |  |

3. If a student chooses to defer their entry within the same academic year, we may be able to defer the scholarship award. However, this may not apply if the applicant chooses to

- defer to the following academic year. We will confirm with all students who defer, the status of their scholarship.
- 4. All communication with the student will be via email, and to their @dundee.ac.uk email address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant.
- 5. If a student has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded a Progressing with Excellence Scholarship, the value of the scholarship will be refunded to the student after they have enrolled at the University of Dundee. Alternatively, this can be transferred to the University accommodation account balance (if applicable).
- 6. If a student receives the award after the University of Dundee has issued a CAS for visa application purposes, then the student will need to get in touch with the University to confirm next steps.
- 7. The scholarship is only awarded in the years in which full UoD fees are paid to the University.
- 8. If a student re-sits a year of study at the University, the scholarship award will not apply, however will commence once they have progressed to the next level.
- 9. Students from non-graduating years at the University are not eligible for the Scholarship.
- 10. The University of Dundee will not back date any awards and all awards made will be current and apply to the student in the current academic year. The University of Dundee will not make awards to students who have already enrolled at the University onto the programme of study.
- 11. If a student withdraws from their programme of study, the University Fees department will be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance.
- 12. All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- 13. All scholarships are awarded and administered in accordance with University policies and procedures.
- 14. All scholarships are subject to the University's scholarship terms and conditions. These are subject to revision from time to time.
