### The International College Dundee Entrant Scholarship

#### Key Facts Document

This Key Facts Document sets out the main details of the Scholarship, as at date of publication.

<b>Scholarship name</b>	International College Dundee (ICD) Entrant Scholarship
<b>Date of publication</b>	July 2021
<b>Application Process</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applicants submit a 350-word statement via the ICD Entrant Scholarship application form.</li><li>• All applications are reviewed by an UoD Academic member of staff and selection is based on quality of personal statement. The value of the scholarship if awarded will vary based on the quality of the application submitted.</li><li>• There are a limited number of awards available.</li></ul>
<b>Who is eligible?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Classified by the University of Dundee and Oxford International Education Group (OIEG) as an International Fee-paying student.</li><li>• Applicants must join an ICD full time programme (online or on campus), AND progress to a full time (180 credits, 12 months for PG; 120 credits per year, 3-4 years for UG), on campus UoD programme.</li></ul>
<b>Award Information</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The value of this scholarship varies between 5 different levels that range from £1000 - £4500 and is awarded as a tuition fee waiver to the UoD fees once the applicant has progressed from ICD to their chosen UoD programme. The value of the scholarship if awarded will vary based on the quality of the application submitted.</li><li>• The scholarship for applicants applying for a pathway programme leading to a UoD undergraduate programme is awarded each year of study, up to a maximum of 4 years up to £18,000 .</li><li>• The scholarship for applicants applying for an ICD pathway programme leading to a UoD postgraduate taught master's is awarded for each year of study, up to a maximum of 2 years up to £9,000.</li><li>• All scholarship awards are offered on an unconditional basis.</li><li>• All scholarship awards are deducted from UD tuition fees and are not paid directly to any applicant.</li></ul>
<b>Key Information</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• ICD applicants cannot be considered for any other University of Dundee Scholarships.</li><li>• Applicants can be in receipt of the ICD Entrant Scholarship and may also be eligible for other funding such as:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ External scholarship, not funded by the University of Dundee (this also includes joint funded scholarships), however the total of both scholarships combined cannot exceed the total yearly tuition fee.</li><li>○ If an applicant has an external scholarship which covers the full tuition fee, then they are no longer eligible to receive a ICD Entrant Scholarship. The University will not pay any money directly to the applicant and the award cannot be transferred.</li><li>○ If an applicant has an external sponsor who cover the full tuition fee, we can award a ICD Entrant Scholarship and the sponsor will be billed the net total (minus the scholarship awarded). If the sponsor will not accept a reduced tuition fee with scholarship applied, then the ICD Entrant Scholarship will not be awarded to the applicant. The University will not pay any money directly to the applicant and the award cannot be transferred.</li></ul></li></ul>

- ICD applicants awarded a pre-matriculation scholarship can top up their scholarship award to a maximum of £5000 based upon their academic performance when studying at ICD. Please see the Key facts document for the ICD Progressing with Excellence document for further details.
- All communication with the applicant will be via email, and to their @dundee.ac.uk email address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant.
- If an applicant has funding as part of a partnership agreement, then they cannot hold an ICD Entrant Scholarship in addition to this. The higher value award will apply.
- If an applicant chooses to defer their entry within the same academic year, we may be able to defer the scholarship award. However, this may not apply if the applicant chooses to defer to the following academic year. We will confirm with all applicants who defer, the status of their scholarship.
- If an applicant has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded a ICD Entrant Scholarship, the value of the scholarship will be refunded to the applicant after they have enrolled at the University of Dundee. Alternatively, this can be transferred to the University accommodation account balance (if applicable).
- If an applicant receives the award after the University of Dundee has issued a CAS for visa application purposes, then the applicant will need to get in touch with the University to confirm next steps.
- The scholarship is only awarded in the years in which full UoD fees are paid to the University.
- If an applicant re-sits a year of study at the University, the scholarship award will not apply, however will commence once they have progressed to the next level.
- Applicants from non-graduating years at the University are not eligible for the scholarship.
- The University of Dundee will not back date any awards and all awards made will be current and apply to the applicant in the current academic year. The University of Dundee will not make awards to students who have already enrolled at the University onto the programme of study.
- If an applicant withdraws from their programme of study, the University Fees department will be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance.
- All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
- All scholarships are awarded and administered in accordance with University policies and procedures.
- All scholarships are subject to the University's scholarship terms and conditions. These are subject to revision from time to time.
