

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- Image 13 wooden building blocks, acrylic paint/ 3D installation/ October 2019
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
Examples of life drawings, drawing from observation, line and tone





Illustration making process example of experiments in sketchbook, in order to create illustrations about preparing food.

Calendar with illustrations made using different shades of grey colour. I made a range of coloured papers using charcoal, oil pastels and pencils, then I photocopied them and created collages representing all months.





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Experiments inspired by leafs found on the ground. I analysed the structure of different kinds of leafs, and tried to depict them using a range of drawing techniques. Then I created patterns, reflecting leafs lying on the pavement.

Collages made from paper covered with ink and photocopied. At the beginning I created birds using only different shades of grey. After that I decided to create some elements of world, those birds could live in. It was a challenging experiment - not to use any additional colour and create illustrations with a character.








Illustration studies - creating illustrations using ink and water. Experimenting with intensity of the ink, in order to create depth of field in my drawings. Sequential illustrations about 'My first lonely hiking trip'. In every piece I was trying to use different perspective and different mark making technique to make the story more interesting.



Experimenting with wet drawing materials. First, in a sketchbook I created some samples of surfaces and marks made using ink, water and paint. Then I learned how to stretch paper and I made some illustrations on it using ideas and effects from a mark making process.











I AM A **MONUMENT** making a construction reflecting my personality. Inspired by artists such as Phyllida Barlow or Gabriella Marcella I made many building blocks and painted them using different patterns. Then I built a range of constructions, trying to answer the question about how childhood shaped my personality.









In the 'Fine Line' project, I was creating drawing using wire and fabric. Inspired by Joan Miro work I made a wire construction, and added elements of face using shapes of negative spaces. It changed my way of thinking about drawing, as I realised how wide a discipline it is.

Textile project - Illustrations made using naturally dyed materials. I coloured fabrics using fruits, herbs, and teas, and created small landscapes from them using a sewing machine.
